	These children and pregnant women must have current, valid immigration documents, including Visas but not DACA. Active duty military, veterans and their immediate families are exempt from the 5-year legal status and 10-year work history requirement.		These immigrants are covered for the first 7 years they are in the U.S. After 7 years, they must adjust status to and meet the requirements for a Legal Permanent Resident to remain eligible. If they do not, they will be eligible for Emergency Medicaid only.	If they meet all other eligibility requirements, undocumented immigrants can be covered for EMERGENCY medical services only.
