 During the school year, Narratio Fellows (ages 13-23) work on an art project and work towards their career or academic goals. Volunteer youth mentors are matched to a Fellow to provide mentorship and support as they work towards their goals.
Volunteers will work closely with ReEstablish Richmond staff to connect Fellows to tools, resources, and opportunities.

- The Narratio Fellowship Youth Mentor role focuses primarily on working with Fellows to identify and work towards their goals. The exact role will vary depending on the unique goals of each Fellow, but projects could include working on resume building, college application and personal essay tips, taking career tests, attending job fairs or university tours, etc. If the volunteer has a particular skill or interest, there may be an opportunity to be matched with a Fellow with that same interest.
- In addition to mentorship, Narratio Fellowship Youth Mentors are encouraged to provide transportation to their Fellow match to in-person meetings, whenever possible.
- Narratio mentorship during the school year includes in-person group workshops on topics such as resume building, writing applications, and hearing from local academic programs such as the Mellon Pathways program. In addition to group workshops, Fellows will receive more individualized support and connection to resources based on their particular goals and interests.
- The Fellows will work on a group art project at monthly meetings led by the Narratio Artist in Residence. These meetings are tentatively scheduled for the third Sunday of each month from 2-5 or 3-6pm, from September until March (excluding December). Most meetings will take place in-person in the Tuckahoe area.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND EXPECTATIONS:

- Communicate regularly with ReEstablish Richmond staff about the match.
- Communicate regularly with the Fellow you are matched with.
- Support and celebrate the Fellow's goals and achievements.
